Re: Meeting Sept 4th, 2013

- Minutes from July meeting were approved.
- Guest Joe Anderson (High Pine Environmental) presented an invasive species
  management plan for the Town Forest. Most of meeting covered Joe's presentation
  and the ensuing discussion. This is a living (draft) document at this point. Bill
  Shane will see if it can be put online. All were in agreement the plan was concise,
  easy to read and well written. Some thoughts:
  - Need to address what happens now next step
  - Pre-treat before harvest? Similar to Rines.
  - We (committee members) should work on access points trail and bench areas
  - Penny suggested sending letters to abutters what we are doing. Also let public know what's going on proactive.
  - Walk again more as a demo now that we have a better understanding of what and how things should be done.
  - Early detection/rapid response hit area as soon as notice invasives.
  - Harvest scheduled sometime between Thanksgiving and Christmas. Coordinate
     have them cut invasives same time?
  - Proposed date for site walk Oct 5<sup>th</sup> (Sat) 1:00. Meet at salt shed entrance.
- Town Forest harvest Penny mentioned that the logging operation in the Farwell Forest is winding down. The Town Forest is next on their list.
- Jan Santerre (Project Canopy coordinator) contacted Sam requesting status update of
  efforts in the Town Forest and an accounting of the funds allocated to the educational
  component of their grant.
  - The forested management plan of the town forest has been completed.
  - Implementation of the forest management plan has more or less been on hold waiting for harvesting – hopefully this winter.
  - A draft of an invasive species management plan has been written.
  - The trail directional markers have been replaced.
  - Old trail informational signs have been documented (digitally) and most removed. Note there were 2 categories of informational signs Freedom Trail

- which was part of a class project and probably won't be replaced and forest habitat signs which hopefully can be replaced.
- We are currently waiting on money from them.
- Informational tree walk in Rines Forest scheduled for 29<sup>th</sup> of September. Put information on Town Website, and Town Crier. Penny also mentioned she will post info on Family network and talk to MS science teacher (Mr. Madden). This coordinates nicely with their tree project. Date is same as Maine Outdoor Weekend so hopefully have a good turnout.
- Planning Board Project nothing discussed.
- Rines Forest no update
- Blueberry Hill logging no update
- Vernal pools no update
- Invasive species grant search no update
- Continuing projects/goals for 2013:
  - Invasive species education: Possibly do a fall presentation with someone from Cooperative Extension.
  - Educational site walk of Rines Forest scheduled for September 29<sup>th</sup> (1:00 pm) with the Maine Tree Club.
  - Update Trail Guide. Sam will contact Brian Sterns to see status of trail system (no update). No update on trail connection between Falmouth trail and Rines Forest. Penny mentioned town looking to buy a Trimble GPS (grant through Norcross Foundation). Use for a variety of Town-wide purposes.
