I. Call to Order

The meeting was called to order by Chairman, David Witherill at 6:00 p.m. with a round table introduction.

II. Adopt the June 17, 2020 Minutes

Chairman Witherill inquired if there were any changes or additions to the Minutes. There were none.

Vote on Recommendations for the Changes to Mooring Ordinance

Mike Schwindt explained the language (listed below, highlighted/underscored) to Chapter 48 of the Ordinance.

§ 48-7.A (1) Personal watercraft storage space is nontransferable and may not be rented or otherwise assigned.

§48-7.A (10) Violation of any portion of this section will result in immediate revocation of storage privileges, inability to rent a rack space in the following year, and will subject the owner to a fee fine as specified

in

§ 84-12 I.

After a brief discussion of the language, it was decided to accept the language.

Motion: To accept the amended changes to Chapter 48.7 to include changing the word from fee to fine.

Peter Garsoe inquired how the commission decided upon 10 hp vs 15 hp outboard motors to be equipped on dinghies. Charles Rumsey presented the updated BCR Personal Watercraft Storage Rack Rental Application which reflected the new language adopted at tonight meeting. The commission agreed to the changes.
