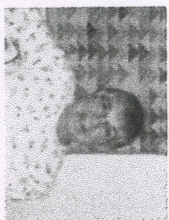
LECTURES OFFERED

1. THE MILL GIRLS OF 1830'S

This lecture introduces you to the New England Textile Mills of the 1830's and the girls who worked there. Hear about their living and working conditions and how cloth was produced. Voices of actual mill workers will make you feel as though you are actually there during this explosive time of quilting history. Everyone's favorite! *25 ANTIQUE QUILTS SHOWN*

2. PLUM CRAZY - 1880 - 1900

Learn how and why the crazy quilts of the late 1800's became so popular. Do crazy quilts talk? What does smoking have to do with crazy quilts? Why were these quilts made from silks and velvets? This lecture will answer these questions and more while showing you wonderful vintage examples of crazy quilts. One of my most popular lectures! 3. FEEDSACKS AND FANCY WORK - 1920's - 1940's

4. PATRIOTS, PROTESTERS, AND PETTICOATS - Civil War

This favorite lecture focuses on 4 different Civil War women who made a difference - an abolitionist, a nurse, a dressmaker, and a teacher. 5. VOTES FOR WOMEN - 1900's

Would you endure hunger strikes, imprisonment, ridicule, and scorn in order to obtain equality and the right to vote? The suffragettes did! You'll hear about their struggles and determination that eventually led to the passage of the 19th Amendment. 6. QUILTING ON THE FARM

-1800's

Discover what quilting was like during the 1800's on the American farm. Hear what resources were available to these women and what inspired them. Do you know how living on a farm influenced quilting? Discover the impact the sewing machine had on the farm.
