

Doughty Road (Cross Road)

March 18, 1807

Warrant, 5th Article: To receive the Selectmen's report of a road laid out from Gloucester Road to Greely Road, beginning near the house of Thomas Prince at Walnut Hill.

April 16, 1807

Town Meeting Voted to dismiss the 5th Article.

May 14, 1810

Town Meeting Voted the report of the Selectmen laying a road from the widow Joel Princes' to Greely Road be not accepted.

Court of Common Pleas, March Term, 1811

On the petition of Alexander Barr and other inhabitants for a town road leading across from New Gloucester road, so called, to the third range way (allowed by the proprietor's of North Yarmouth for a road) east of Falmouth line (Greely Road), The Court accept and approve of said way and order that the same be recorded in the Town Book. (Record of proceeding including description of way is in the County Commissioners Records, Vol. III, p. 528)

March 4, 1811

Town Meeting Voted that the Town "take no order" on the petition of Alexander Barr and others in the Court of Common Pleas.

April 24, 1811

Warrant, 9th Article: To see if Town will discontinue the road laid out from New Gloucester Road to the range way over land late the property of John Prince and now owned by John Symmonds, agreeably to the petition of Alexander Barr and others, and act thereon as may be thought proper, by the request of John

Symmonds and others.

Warrant, 15th Article: Request of Jeremiah Prince to be allowed damages for a road through his land.

May 13, 1811 .

Town Meeting Voted John Symmonds be allowed \$100 for damages for a road through his land which he purchased of the heirs of Thomas Prince in addition to \$100 allowed by the Selectmen.

Town Meeting Voted that the 9th and 15th Articles be dismissed.

May 11, 1812

Town Meeting Voted that Eleazer Ring be allowed \$62 for damages and costs of laying a road through his land agreeable to the report of the referees agreed upon by the Selectmen and said Ring.
