

FOREST LAKE ROAD

LENGTH: 4,172' (.8 MILES)

WIDTH: 21'

JULY 21, 1930:

Town Meeting voted to dismissed the request of L.A. Pourpart and others to see if the Town will improve the road leading from the Old Gray Road to Forest Lake, near the Gray line.

MARCH 6, 1956:

Upon Motion of Robert Cram, duly seconded, Town Meeting voted to accept the town way as laid out by the Selectmen and described in the article:

Beginning at a point at or near the center of the Blackstrap Road, so-called, and extending in a northerly direction to a point on the Cumberland-Gray town line, said way to have a width on each side of a survey base line as shown on the Property Plan on file with Town Clerk, said survey base line being described as follows, to wit:

Beginning at a point at or near the center of the Blackstrap Road, so-called, said point designated as Station P.C. 2916+00.25, as shown on a property Plan entitled "Maine Turnpike Authority, Maine Turnpike, Section 2 - Portland to Augusta", dated March, 1955, said Plan to be placed on file line the Town Records, the survey baseline herein described being shown on Cumberland Supplemental Sheet Number 4 of said Plan; thence northerly by a six degree curve to the left of radius nine hundred fifty-four and ninety-three hundredths (954.93) feet a distance of eight hundred seventy-four and forty-four hundredths (874.44) feet to Station P.T. 2924+74.69; thence north twenty-eight degrees forty-five minutes west a distance of four hundred nineteen and forty-eight hundredths (419.48) feet of Station P.C. 2928+94.17; thence northerly by a four degree curve to the right of radius one thousand four hundred thirty-two and forty hundredths (1432.40) feet a distance of nine hundred seventy-nine and seventeen hundredths (979.17) feet to a Equation Station P.T. 2938+73.34 Back, which is equal to Station P.T. 2938+62.44 Ahead; thence north ten degrees fifteen minutes east a distance of six hundred ninety-five and eighty hundredths (695.80) feet to Station P.C. 2945.+58.24; thence northerly by a four degree and thirty minute curve to the left of radius one thousand two hundred seventy-three and twenty -four hundredths (1273.24) feet a distance of four hundred eighty-nine and sixty-three hundredths (489.63) to Station P.T. 2950+47.87; thence north eleven degrees forty-seven minutes west a distance of forty and thirty-three hundredths (40.33) feet to a point at or near the Cumberland-Gray town line; bearings in the foregoing description are referred to the true meridian.
