DESCRIPTION OF ALIGNMENT:

As redefined by the Cumberland County Commissioners and the Selectmen of Cumberland, Maine, May, 1922.

Beginning at the most westerly corner of the Home lot of Miss Gertrude St. Clair (Situated on the southeasterly side of the Federal Road, so called); thence S. 48 degrees E. 195.4 feet along the line of the stone wall to the westerly corner of the shed of the said St. Clair; thence by the same course 245.4 feet to a stone monument; thence by the same course 85 feet to a stone monument; thence S. 57 degrees - 48' E. 68.5 feet to a stone monument; thence S. 61 degrees - 23'E. 118 feet to a stone monument; thence S. 74 degrees - 11'E. 67 feet to a stone monument near the shore line and cottage. This line is the northeasterly side line is parallel with and 33 feet distance from said described line and is marked with four stone monuments and iron bolts. as shown on accompanying plan.

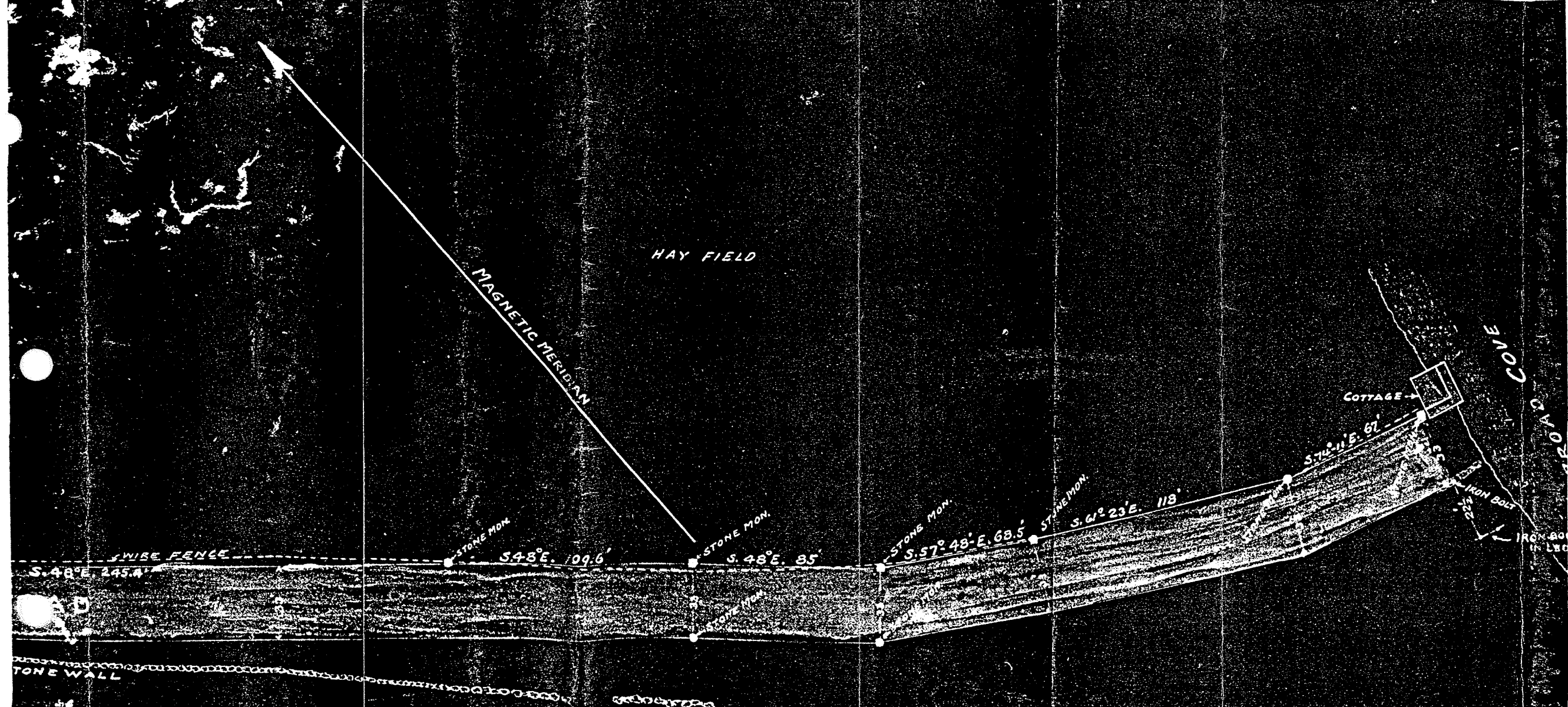

Voted that Jonathan Greely be Moderator of this meeting.

Voted to dismiss the second Article of the Warrant.

Voted that the Selectmen be directed to examine the Bridge near the house of Daniel Merrill and make an estimate of the quantity of stone and other materials necessary to rebuild said Bridge and that they advertise for sealed proposals for said materials to be furnished to be paid for our of the assessment of 1839.

Voted that the Selectmen be directed to take such measures in relation to building a Wharf on the town farm as in their opinion the interest of the town requires.

Voted that this meeting be dissolved.
