Beginning at a stake standing on the westerly side of said County Road (Main Street) on a course of north 62 1/2 degrees east 5 rods and 2 links distance from the most easterly corner of said Richard Stubb's new dwelling house and from said stake running north 63 1/2 degrees west rods. Thence north 75 1/2 degrees west 82 1/2 rods. Said road to be three (3) rods in width lying on the left hand of the aforesaid courses, so far as the above distances are run, and from the end of the last mentioned distance to run south 50 degrees west 14 rods. Thence south 29 degrees west 13 rods. Thence south 82 degrees west until it enters the aforesaid rangeway (Range Road) leading by Nathaniel Merrill's new dwelling house, and from the end of the distance of the 82 1/2 rods above mentioned until it comes to said range way. The road is to be four (4) rods in width, lying on the left hand or a southerly side of the above given courses.

Town Meeting Voted that the report of the Selectmen laying out a road from Richard Stubb's house to the town road (or rangeway) that leads by Nathaniel Merrill's house be accepted.

### SEPTEMBER 18,1847

The Subscribers Selectmen of Cumberland upon the application of Zenas Prince and others to widen and straighten the Town Road leading from the County Road (Main Street) near William Stubbs house to the bridge near Daniel Merrill's house, having given seven (7) days written notice of out intention to widen and straighten the same, and stated in the said notice the termini thereof by posting up said notice in the two public places in said town and in the vicinity of places in said town and in the vicinity of places in said town and in the vicinity of the proposed route according to law, and having met at the time and place appointed for that purpose and having personally examined said road and are of the opinion that said road ought to be widened and straightened, we therefore lay out said road as follows:

Beginning on the center of the bridge near Daniel Merrill's house, then N 47 1/2 E 7 rods, thence N 53 1/2 E 3 rods, thence N 44 E14 rods 52 1/2 E 10 rods to a stake near Samuel Merrill's barn, the courses and distances taken for the middle of the road, and said road is four (4) rods wide. Thence from said stake near said S. Merrill's barn S 84 E 2 rods thence S 73 1/2 E 81 1/2 rods thence S 54 E 10 1/2 rods to the County Road (Main Street) the courses and distances taken for the middle of the road is three (3) rods wide. Which saidlaying out with the boundaries and admeasurements have been filed with the Town Clerk on the 18th day of September being seven (7) days before this meeting, and we now hereby report such widening and straightening with the bounds and admeasurements of the same to said town at a

# SEPTEMBER 18,1847

Warrant, 4th Article: To see if the Town will accept the doings of the Selectmen with regard to widening and straightening the town way leading from the County Road by William Stubb's house to the bridge below Daniel Merrill's house and act thereon.

Town Meeting voted to accept the report of the Selectmen in respect to the Town Road leading from the County Road near William Stubbs' house to the bridge near Daniel Merrill's house.

### MARCH 5, 1929

Town Meeting voted one-hundred (\$100.) dollars for setting monuments on Tuttle Road and Turkey Lane.

# 1948 Annual Report

Road Commissioner reported bridge rebuilt on Turkey Lane.

### DECEMBER 1, 1959

On the petition of the Town Selectmen, the County Commissioner's ordered that the portion of Turkey Lane between Richard M. Anderson's place and the Range Road and leading by the summer house of Mrs. Elizabeth Merrill Hay shall not be opened for travel during December 1 through April 30. (County Commissioner's Docket No. 1307, June Term, 1960)
