

Re: 18-085 – Oxford Lane Land Gift

Pursuant to your policy related to accepting new lands, the Lands & Conservation Commission has submitted a recommendation "not to accept" the land from Paul Benard. Mr. Benard and his neighbors have been in a long dispute over his new subdivision and the usage of Windsor Lane for the residents of Oxford lane. I believe that dispute has been resolved and one of Mr. Benard's new lots was required to be left as open space.

If left as open space with the restrictions on the lot, the Assessor believes the value of the lot will be less than \$40,000 or about \$800 in property taxes.

Dear Chairman Copp:

The Town Council recently referred the offer of a four-acre gift to the Lands and Conservation Commission (LCC) for a recommendation.

The LCC recognizes the significant scenic view of the property and its proximity to the Rines Forest and that acceptance of the gift would help protect the open space.

We also recognize that, because of the restricted public access and other limitations placed on the property through the bylaws and restrictive covenants, there would be very limited benefit to Cumberland citizens. Additionally, the Town would be responsible for added road maintenance costs associated with Oxford Lane.

Consequently, while the offer is attractive and the land could be a good addition to Rines Forest, because of the limitations placed on the land, we recommend the Town not accept the offer.
