To hear a Proclamation from the Lands & Conservation Commission for the Town of Cumberland to become a Tree City



OFFICIAL PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS	in 1872, the Nebraska Board of Agriculture established a special day to be set aside for the planting of trees, and
WHEREAS	this holiday, called Arbor Day, was first observed with the planting of more than a million trees in Nebraska, and
WHEREAS	Arbor Day is now observed throughout the nation and the world, and
WHEREAS	trees can be a solution to combating climate change by reducing the erosion of our precious topsoil by wind and water, cutting heating and cooling costs, moderating the temperature, cleaning the air, producing life-giving oxygen, and providing habitat for wildlife, and
WHEREAS	trees are a renewable resource giving us paper, wood for our homes, fuel for our fires, and countless other wood products, and
WHEREAS	trees in our city increase property values, enhance the economic vitality of business areas, and beautify our community, and
WHEREAS	trees — wherever they are planted — are a source of joy and spiritual renewal.
NOW, THEREFORE,	We, the Town Council of Cumberland, Maine, do hereby proclaim the last Friday of April as ARBOR DAY in the Town of Cumberland, Maine. We urge all citizens to celebrate Arbor Day and to support efforts to protect our trees and woodlands, and
FURTHER	We urge all citizens to plant trees to gladden the heart and promote the well-being of future generations.
